Title: Joy to the World

Composer: Mason, Lowell

Arranger: Dewagtere, Bernard

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Instrumentation: Vibraphone or Marimba or Xylophone, piano or organ

Style: Christmas - Carols

Comment: The music for this famous hymn was adapted and arranged by Lowell Mason from an older melody which was then believed to have originated from Handel, not least because the theme of the refrain (‘And heaven and nature sing...’) appears in the orchestra opening and accompaniment of the recitative ‘Comfort Ye’ from Handel's Messiah, and the first four notes match the beginning of the choruses ‘Lift up your heads and Glor...
